

NOTICE TO EXHIBITORS

The safety of the dog is our primary concern. By entering this trial, exhibitors acknowledge that they are familiar with the rules and regulations of this sport, and that their dogs are familiar with and are able to perform all obstacles safely.

Important Note: *Be sure to include a photocopy of your dog's temporary or permanent jump height card AND the signed Cedar Run Horse Center Release and Waiver of Liability Form. Otherwise, you must check in at the trial in order to receive your armbands.*

No exhibitor access to building for setups until 7:00 a.m. on Saturday, Nov. 13.

Access to the horse center is via a residential neighborhood. Please observe speed limit and be considerate when traveling through the neighborhood. NO parking outside the horse center entrance.

Please follow the direction of parking attendants and pay strict attention to designated off-limits areas on the grounds for dogs and/or exhibitors – i.e. stall areas, etc.

In order to conserve indoor crating space, no ex-pens unless for multiple dogs. Please conserve as much space as possible in your setup areas so that everyone can find indoor space. The trial committee reserves the right to ask exhibitor cooperation in doing so.

Puppies under 6 months of age are strictly prohibited from the grounds. **All dogs must be on a leash** at all times except when in the ring, when in the designated agility warm-up area, when crated, or when in a secure ex-pen. **Exhibitors are responsible for being at the ring gate** when it is their turn to run.

Entry fees will not be refunded in the event that a dog is absent, disqualified, excused, or barred from competition by the action of the Trial Committee. **No entry fee will be refunded if the trial cannot open or be completed** by reason of riots, civil disturbances, fire, an act of God, public emergency, act of a public enemy, or any other cause beyond the control of the organizing committee.

Catalogs are available on a prepaid basis for \$8.00. There will be a very limited quantity of catalogs available for sale at the trial at \$10.00 each.

It is expressly understood that **exhibitors alone are responsible for the behavior of their dogs and/or children.** Any exhibitor whose dogs and/or children create unnecessary disturbances or repeatedly engage in unsafe or disruptive behavior may, at the discretion of the Trial Committee, be asked to leave the show site. In such case, no refund will be made of any entry fees paid.

Refunds (all but \$5 of the entry fees) will be made for **bitches in season** and for **dogs or handlers with injuries preventing them from competing (i.e. post-surgery).** (Veterinarian's/physician's note or other form of proof should be presented.) The Trial Secretary must be notified of such claims for refund at the trial or in writing no later than noon on Monday, Nov. 8, 2004.

Returned checks do not constitute a valid entry fee. The Trial Secretary will add a \$25.00 collection fee to the amount of each returned check. Subsequent returned checks from the same exhibitors may result in their being put on a CASH ONLY basis.

Please clean up after your dog - there will be pooper scoopers available for your use. Help us keep the grounds clean and neat so that dog events will be welcomed in the future.

FOOD AND DRINKS (breakfast and lunch) will be available for sale. Volunteers will receive lunch tickets and have access to club hospitality.

300 RUNS PER JUDGE PER DAY (600 total runs per day).

ENTRY FEES: \$22 first entry & \$12 second entry of same dog on same day.

IMPORTANT NOTE: Each exhibitor **MUST sign and return the Cedar Run Horse Center's release form (contained herein) and enclose it with the entry form(s).** Armbands will not be mailed to those exhibitors who have not returned this form. Armbands will be provided at the trial upon the signing of the release form.

CONFIRMATION OF ENTRIES: All entrants will be sent a judging program with directions to the grounds and a running order. These will be mailed after the closing date of October 20, 2004. *Telephone messages concerning the trials will be returned on a collect basis.*

Note: If you wish early confirmation of acceptance into the trials, enclose a pre-addressed, post-paid post card and it will be returned.

There will be no e-mail confirmation of acceptance into the trials.

PRIZES AND AWARDS: Rosettes will be awarded to the 1st through 4th place dogs in each jump height division in each class. Qualifying ribbons and toys will be awarded to all dogs receiving qualifying scores. Dogs must qualify to receive placement or qualifying ribbons and prizes. Perfect score ribbons for Novice, Open and Excellent A classes will also be awarded.

New title rosettes and special MX/MXJ dog neck rosettes will be awarded. Those completing MX or MXJ titles will also receive treat jars with homemade treats from Redchief Express Dog Bakery (Edie Allyn) in memory of U-ACHX U-CDX EZ Back To Skool Saddle Shoe VCD2 MX MXJ ("Lacey").

Those completing MACHs will receive a special rosette, MACH bar, and etched treat jar by Ann Priddy in memory of U-ACHX Ch. Ging's Diamond Dust VCD2 MX MXJ ("Slider").

Prizes will be offered for the highest scoring Cocker Spaniel in each class.

Treat jars etched with artwork by Ann Priddy will be offered to the HS Cocker from each class (one per owner per weekend). Additional HS Cocker wins will earn biscuits for the jar.

CLASS INFORMATION

Regular and Preferred Classes will be offered each day. Dogs shall not be eligible to participate in more than one Regular Standard Class & one Regular Jumpers with Weaves (JWW) class OR one Preferred Standard Class and one Preferred JWW Class in any AKC agility trial. Dogs must be entered ONLY in Regular Classes or in Preferred Classes, with no crossover between them being allowed at the same set of trials.

Novice Agility Class (Std. or JWW)

The Novice Agility class is divided into Division A for persons and dogs that have never acquired an agility title from any organization, and Division B for dogs that have acquired the Novice Agility title, persons that have handled a dog to an agility title, and agility judges.

Open Agility Class (Std. or JWW)

Open to dogs that have acquired the Novice Agility or Open Agility titles, but that have not acquired a qualifying score toward the Agility Excellent title.

Agility Excellent Class (Std. or JWW)

Division A is for dogs that have acquired the Open Agility title but that have not acquired a qualifying score in the Excellent B Class. Division B is for dogs that have acquired the AX (or AXJ) title and for dogs that have acquired the MX (or MXJ) title.

PREFERRED CLASS INFORMATION

The owner/handler may choose to enter the Preferred Standard Class and Preferred JWW Class in lieu of entering the Regular Standard Class and the Regular JWW Class. The dog must be entered only in Preferred Classes or only in Regular Classes, with no crossover between them being allowed at the same set of trials. All dogs entering the Preferred Classes for the first time **MUST** enter the Novice level in both the Preferred Standard Agility Class and/or the Preferred JWW class regardless of their previous title level in the Regular Classes. (There is no grandfathering of titles for the Regular Classes to the Preferred Classes or from the Preferred Classes to the Regular Classes. These Classes are separate titling programs and in both cases the dogs must start at the Novice level.)

This site is an INDOOR site (horse arena – not climate controlled). Ring size is 80' x 100'. The surface is “rubber footing” (manufactured sand w/shredded rubber) and works well for agility. This site is in the Dale City, Va. area and is between Manassas, Va. (I-66) and Woodbridge, Va. (I-95).

From I-66:

Take Exit 44 - Rt. 234 South (which is called the Prince Wm. Parkway here - and also known as the Rt. 234 “bypass”).

In approximately 8 miles, the Prince Wm. Parkway turns left; however, continue straight and stay on Rt. 234 South.

You will soon cross the Occoquan Creek Bridge. At the 1st stoplight after the bridge, you will see a 7-11 on the left (Purcell Rd.) Go straight through this stoplight.

Continue for 2 more stoplights (small strip center w/7-11 on the left). Turn left onto Hoadly Road (Rt. 642)

Continue on Hoadly Road for approximately 2.2 miles, going through stoplight at Kahns Rd.

Turn right onto Spriggs Rd.

Continue on Spriggs Rd. for approximately 2.2 miles to the “2nd” Anthony Drive.

Turn right onto Anthony Drive. (Note: Anthony Drive “horseshoes” onto Spriggs Road and therefore meets it twice.) Landmark assistance: Just beyond the right turn onto Anthony Drive, you will see white 3-board fencing on the corner lot.

Make 1st left turn onto Leilani Drive and follow to horse center.

From Prince Wm. Parkway/Liberia Ave. intersection in Manassas:

Follow Prince Wm. Parkway East for approximately 9 miles to stoplight at Hoadly Road.

Turn right onto Hoadly Road.

Follow for approximately 2 miles to stoplight at Dale Blvd (7-11 on left).

Continue straight through this stoplight.

Make 1st left onto Spriggs Road (no stoplight here) and follow directions above.

From I-95:

Take Exit 152B (Rt. 234 N) toward Manassas.

Follow Rt. 234 for approximately 3.3 miles to right turn at stoplight onto Spriggs Road. (Note: This is the 1st stoplight after Waterway Drive.) After turning onto Spriggs Road, you will see Forest Park High School on the right.)

Follow Spriggs Rd. for approximately 1.4 miles to the stoplight at Minnieville Rd. Go straight through this stoplight (Food Lion shopping center on the right).

Continue on Spriggs Road for less than one mile. Look for white 3-board fencing on a corner lot on the left. Turn left just after the white fencing onto Anthony Drive.

Make 1st left onto Leilani Drive and follow to horse center.

HEIGHT DIVISIONS

Owners are responsible for entering the proper height division.

All dogs that have not provided a photocopy of a permanent or valid temporary Jump Height Card with their entry and/or those not presenting an original permanent or valid temporary Jump Height Card on the day of the trial shall be measured by a judge of record prior to competing (except those in the 24" height division).

Note: Armbands will be mailed to all who have provided Jump Height Card photocopies with their entries AND who have ALSO provided a signed Cedar Run Horse Center release form.

If a dog's height at the withers exceeds the maximum allowed for the jump height in which the dog is entered, the dog shall be moved up into the proper jump height if the dog is measured prior to its run. In no case may a dog be moved down in height based on a judge's measurement at a trial.

DOGS ELIGIBLE TO ENTER: This trial is open to all dogs over the age of 12 months that are registered with the American Kennel Club or are registrable breeds that have obtained AKC ILP numbers, except bitches in season, aggressive dogs, or dogs suffering from any deformity, injury, or illness that may affect the dog's physical or mental performance. Mixed breeds and breeds not registrable with the AKC are not eligible to enter. Refer to Chapter 2 of the AKC Registration and Discipline Rules for a list of registrable breeds that may participate.

COURSE FAMILIARIZATION (WALK-THROUGHS): Handlers in all classes are permitted to walk the course, without a dog, prior to the start of the class. The walk-through allows handlers to plan their strategy for running the course. A walk-through period will be held prior to each class, before or after the judge's briefing.

OBSTACLE FAMILIARIZATION AND WARM-UPS:

Contact obstacle familiarization for Novice A & B Dogs will NOT be offered at these trials.

A warm-up area, consisting of a regulation agility jump, will be provided for all exhibitors. Exhibitors may not use the warm-up area or any other area inside the arena in order to relieve their dogs.

EXHIBITOR INFORMATION

At the handler's option, dogs may wear flat buckle collars, but there shall be no tags or attachments. Choke collars, pinch collars, electric and dummy electric collars are prohibited. Food and toys are not permitted in the course area, and handlers are not permitted to use whistles or other instruments or devices.

Exhibitors should follow their veterinarians' recommendations to assure their dogs are free of internal and external parasites, any communicable diseases, and have appropriate vaccinations.

CLASS ORDER

This is a two-ring, two-judge trial. Regular Classes will be followed by Preferred Classes within each class, division and jump height. In all Excellent and Novice classes, A and B classes will run concurrently. Standard and JWW classes will be judged in the following order each day:

Standard Classes Ring:

(Note: this ring starts at 9:00 a.m. on Saturday and 8:00 a.m. on Sunday)

Excellent, Open, Novice

JWW Classes Ring: (starting 30 minutes after start of Standard Classes)

Open, Novice, Excellent

Running Order will be determined at the time of closing of entries and will be included in the Judging Schedule, which will be sent to all exhibitors. (Running order by jump height will be from small dogs to large dogs each day.)

Move-Ups for Saturday Nov.13 must be received in writing (e-mail is acceptable) by the Trial Secretary no later than noon on Monday, November 8, 2004. Move-ups for Sunday, Nov.14 must be made by the end of the trial on Nov.13. Dogs moved up will be entered at the end of the running order.

By participating in any way in any activity at Cedar Run Horse Center, or on property leased by **(the barn manager)** or on any other property by invitation as a participant in a Cedar Run Horse Center activity, and in consideration for the opportunities provided by Cedar Run Horse Center and each owner/manager to the undersigned participant (including any minor participant for whom he/she signs this agreement) the undersigned hereby agrees as follows:

This agreement is made pursuant to the provisions of the Virginia Equine Activity Liability Act (Code of Virginia, Section 3.1-796.130, et. seq) as it may now provide or hereafter be amended (the Act). All terms defined by the Act shall have the same meaning herein, and the Act is hereby incorporated in this agreement by reference. This agreement shall be so construed as to provide to Cedar Run Horse Center (the sponsor/Professional) the fullest protection of a release, waiver of right to sue and assumption of all risks which is afforded to it by the Act.

The participant hereby acknowledges that he/she has full and complete notice and understanding of all the risks inherent in equine activities which may cause, contribute to or result in death or personal injury of the participant or damage to the participant's property (the risks), including but not necessarily limited to: the propensity of any equine to behave in dangerous ways or to trip or to fall; the inability to predict an equine's reaction to sound, movements, objects, persons, animals, excitement, weather conditions, all types of creatures and the effect of such reactions; and the hazards of surface or subsurface conditions including objects or conditions on, under, or protruding from the surface, whether apparent or not. The participant hereby acknowledges that riding an equine is a high risk sport and that he/she is participating at his/her own risk.

Participant hereby Releases and Waives all rights which he/she may have or hereafter have against Cedar Run Horse Center, **(the barn manager)**, property owner(s), and all their employees, officials or agents and each owner for death, personal injury, or property damage which is in any way associated with the risks and he/she does hereby waive his/her right to sue or to bring any action against any of the foregoing in connection therewith. He/She further agrees to indemnify and defend the sponsor/professional and each owner from and shall hold each of them harmless against any such suit or action.

If this agreement is executed by the undersigned participant for and on behalf of a minor participant, the undersigned participant hereby warrants and represents that he/she is in fact the legal parent or guardian of such minor, with full rights of custody and control; that this agreement is given on behalf of and is intended to be binding upon said minor participant and the heirs, personal representatives, successors and assigns of any participant; and the undersigned participant further agrees that this agreement shall also be as fully binding on the undersigned participant as if it were entered into solely on his/her behalf.

I have fully read and fully understand the foregoing release and waiver and I do hereby enter into the same knowingly, freely and voluntarily and with the understanding that Cedar Run Horse Center is relying upon the statements made herein in permitting the participant's participation in any equine activities.
